The Village of Suffern is applying for Community Development Block Grant Recovery (“CDBG-DR”) funds from the New York State Governor’s Office of Storm Recovery (“GOSR”), NY Rising Community Reconstruction (“NYRCR”) Program for the Hardening of Water Treatment Plants and Backup Power for Critical Facilities Projects. The Village of Suffern is soliciting the services of a professional services firm to perform Bidding Assistance, Construction Management and Inspection Services under NYRCR Program.

The procedures for the selection of this professional services firm will be in accordance with the procurement requirements of the Community Development Block Grant- Disaster Recovery (“CDBG-DR”) funds from the New York State Governor’s Office of Storm Recovery (“GOSR”), NY Rising Community Reconstruction (“NYRCR”) Program. All responses received will be evaluated in accordance with the selection criteria and corresponding point system, which is identified in the Request for Qualifications package. That package also identifies the scope of services to be performed by the selected firm.

The Village of Suffern will award the contract to the respondent obtaining the highest score in the evaluation process.
